

Club of the Year Award Submission

The "First Crusade" (name of the first golf hole) was launched at Camelot Golf and Country Club in 1991. My personal experiences as a club member for the past 27 years, and member of the Board of Governors for the past 5, can easily be described as legendary. As current president of the club, I fully support Camelot's nomination for Club of the Year in the medium size category.

The 'Camelot Chronicles' are filled with events of historic significance that have contributed to its current status as one of the highest ranked clubs in the region, province, and country. As a result of these rankings Camelot Golf and Country Club has hosted numerous regional and national championships. The successful hosting of the 2017 Canadian Junior Girl's Championship has been followed by the honour of hosting the 2018 World Junior Girl's Championship in September of this year.
